#### ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- The Kingdom of Cambodia (the Recipient) will implement the Cambodia Inclusive Livestock Value Chains Project (P180535), with the involvement of through its Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF) as set out in the Grant Agreement. The International Development Association, acting as Supervising Entity of Global Agriculture and Food Security Program (the World Bank) has agreed to provide financing for the Project, as set out in the referred agreement.
- 2. The Recipient shall ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) and this Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP), in a manner acceptable to the Bank. The ESCP is a part of the Grant Agreement. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the referred agreement.
- 3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the Recipient shall carry out or cause to be carried out, including, as applicable, the timeframes of the actions and measures, institutional, staffing, training, monitoring and reporting arrangements, and grievance management. The ESCP also sets out the environmental and social (E&S) instruments that shall be adopted and implemented under the Project, all of which shall be subject to prior consultation and disclosure, consistent with the ESS, and in form and substance, and in a manner acceptable to the World Bank. Once adopted, said E&S instruments may be revised from time to time with prior written agreement by the World Bank.
- 4. As agreed by the World Bank and the Recipient, this ESCP will be revised from time to time if necessary, during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, the Recipient, through MAFF, and the World Bank agree to update the ESCP to reflect these changes through an exchange of letters signed between the World Bank and the Recipient's Representative specified in the Grant Agreement. The Recipient shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
